BACHELOR OF ARTS PSYCHOLOGY GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Students may complete up to a Maximum of 42 credits at the 1000 level.
- 2. Students must complete a Minimum of 48 credits at 3000/4000 level

- 3. Students must complete a minimum of 54 credits of psychology courses, comprised of 21 lower-level credits (7 courses) and 33 upper-level credits (11 courses), as described above.
- Students must also complete the university's General Education requirements, including the completion of the capstone course (PSYC 4280), which must be taken in the final 30 credits of study.
