GUIDELINES FOR BACHELOR OF ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

Admission into the Bachelor of Elementary Education degree requires a minimum of 60 academic credits. TRU students typically prepare for entry by completing coursework from the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, or Bachelor of Science programs.
