Academic Requirements

The Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) is a four-year degree with admission at third year. To be eligible for admission to the BSW program, applicants must have a minimum of 54 credits of transferable coursework (60 recommended) with a minimum GPA of 2.33 in the most recent 24 credits. This is a Selective Admission program; meeting the minimum requirement does not guarantee acceptance.

Individuals applying to the TRU BSW program must complete the TRU Bachelor of Social Work Admission Statement.

The credit requirements for admission can be met in the following two ways:

- 1. General university studies (see list of acceptable electives on Page 2 of this form); Min. 60 credits required for admission (Students with 54 credits may be considered). Admission decisions are based on applicant's most recent 24 credits of general university coursework.
- 2. Or completion of a Human Service Diploma and/or Education Assistant and Community Support Certificate Program with a minimum of 54 credits.
