Receive a Conditional Letter of Acceptance (CLOA) within 10–15 business days (undergrad) or 4–6 weeks (grad).

3 Payment

Pay tuition deposits through PayMyTuition by bank transfer, debit, or credit card at tru.ca/pay.

4 Official Acceptance

Receive your official Letter of Acceptance (LOA). TRU obtains your Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) on your behalf.

5 Study permit with BorderPass

Apply for your study permit through BorderPass, with support, review, and submission by Canadian immigration lawyers at no extra cost.

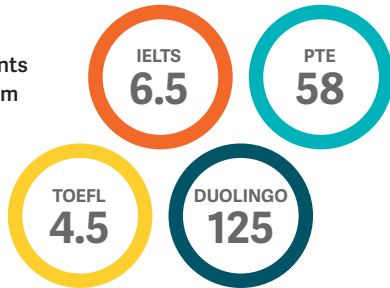
