LADDERING OPTIONS

If you have successfully completed the Graduate Certificate in Educational Studies (GCES) program, you can ladder into the MEd program. Take the GCES if you need to upgrade your GPA to meet MEd admission requirements, or if you are an international student who is currently developing the English language and academic skills necessary to succeed in the MEd program.

FINANCIAL AWARDS

As a TRU student, you are eligible to apply for a variety of awards. Search TRU's awards guide on the Student Awards and Financial Support page at **tru.ca/awards**.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

From how you begin to the way you graduate, make the MEd your own.

Apply: Enter TRU's MEd with a four-year degree or ladder in from a Graduate Certificate in Educational Studies (GCES). Course takers can also apply and register for up to seven courses without completing the degree.

Learn: Take courses on campus, online or a combination of both. MEd courses are offered both day and evening throughout the year. Study part-time or full-time. Take up to five years to complete the program.

Choose: Complete five required core courses and select electives that spark your interest: curriculum, educational leadership, inclusive and special education, Indigenous education, and school counselling.

Indigenization. Learn the benefits of Indigenization, and how to incorporate Indigenous values and world views through up to six Coyote Project elective courses.

Achieve: meet graduation requirements through a thesis, final project or capstone course.

PROGRAM SUPPORTS

Faculty. Our class sizes are small. Our faculty are experienced, representing a range of professional fields and research interests.
